

## Other ideas for teaching the Last Supper

If none of these ideas work, you might also try the following:

Art – compile art images by famous and not so famous artists. Include Leonardo daVinci’s version, but also something more surreal such as Salvador Dali’s. Inspired by these, children can create their own pictures, can try and copy one of these pictures, or the image can be projected and they can trace and paint the image as a group project.

Computer – see Sunday Software for a list of other programs to teach this story. You could also search the web for multi-cultural celebrations of communion.

Cooking – You could have other elements of a Passover Seder.

Drama – Have children take on roles as disciples (one as Judas, one as Peter and others) and let them be interviewed by a reporter. Have other news anchors back in the studio making comments.

Games – Some form of Q&A seems to work best for this lesson, but there are many games you can utilize. Pick a favorite from a previous time.

Movies -- Watch several movies that depict the Last Supper and compare and contrast them. If possible find a clip that follows Matthew/Mark, Luke and John and discuss differences.
